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


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

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
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Doggone Good Time

When you look at your pet, circled up beside you on the floor, playing fetch in the yard with your kids, or riding shotgun on the way to the groomer, what do you see? A loyal friend, a trusted confidant, a playful exercise partner?

Everybody sees their pet differently. Some people focus on the pedigree, others view them as furry companions; most however treat their pets just like a member of the family and take their well-being to heart each and every day. For this age-less "child" of the family, rules may be broken, lessons unlearned and sins forgiven. Why? Because your pet's spirited curiosity leads to amazing discovery and downright joy. Whether you're traveling with your pet, or you just want to emulate their energetic approach to life, a trip to Vermont means a doggone good time for man (or woman!) and beast.

IT'S A DOG'S LIFE IN VERMONT

Most people love to play. Atop a mountain, in the middle of a lake, on a farm, or in the woods, there's rest and rejuvenation, adventure and whimsy, scenery and sounds of nature in all four seasons in Vermont. Hiking, paddling, rummaging and roaming with a four-legged companion is exhilarating – many pets and their human counterparts will explore with tail-wagging Labrador bravado, abandoning the trail in favor of open space, hell-bent

to fully engage all five senses. Others experience with a more reserved, feline independence, cautious yet curious as they scale to new heights or launch into unknown waters.

Here, outdoor adventure comes in all shapes and sizes, and play-cations are packaged to appeal to a variety of tastes, interests, and breeds. Lush Green Mountain forests, long winding roads, and crisp, clear lakes and ponds are the backdrop for endless possibilities. Our cars and trucks are equipped with racks loaded with road and mountain bikes, kayaks and canoes, or cargo carriers toting camping gear – all the ingredients that enable instant gratification when the sun is shining and the fish are biting.

HIKING AND WALKING

Who doesn't like to go for a walk and unleash oneself from responsibility and routine? It's easy to put your best foot or paw forward in Vermont, whether you have two or four, where our mountains are accessible. Wooded trails are often a short drive from quaint villages or mere steps away from resort accommodations.

One of our treasures is America's oldest long-distance hiking trail, the **Long Trail**, which spans 272 miles (389 km) from the Massachusetts border to Canada. Whether you lace up your boots to tackle the entire end-to-end journey or venture off on a day hike to one of the many summits, like Stratton Mountain, Killington Peak, Camel's Hump, or Mount Mansfield – Vermont's

highest peak – you'll be rewarded with spectacular 360 degree views all over New England and the state of New York. If you do tackle a mountain with your dog, please keep them under your control and on the trail. Always bring along a leash, extra water and a baggie or two.

For shorter, family-centric jaunts to discover colorful wildflowers, wild blueberries or musical songbirds, try the trail to **Pleiad Lake** in Ripton, one of Vermont's highest lakes; the footpaths of **Mount Independence** in Orwell, an active archeology site with Revolutionary War historical features; or **Mount Philo** in Charlotte, with sweeping Lake Champlain vistas. To find hiking on state lands, family-friendly hikes, or inn-to-inn guided hiking tours, turn to pages 103–105 of this guidebook, or visit the website of Vermont State Parks (www.vtstateparks.com).

You may seek a different sort of path to travel, one that is more flat and urban. While the surface may be predictable, the journey is far from it as you stroll through our **Designated Towns** on paved recreation paths or rail trails (see page 96 of this guidebook to find a Designated Downtown). Outdoor dining, sculptures and statues, floral gardens, historic markers and classic New England architecture are interwoven into the natural landscape of these vibrant communities. Or, head out of town to walk the acclaimed, tree canopied roads of Vermont bordered by stone fences keeping cows at bay. And, if your dog likes to "ruff it" too, the **West River Trail** in Jamaica, or **Stowe Recreation Path**, are just a few of the many "walkin' the dog" options available to Fido. Keep your pet on a leash in town, and be aware that while many businesses are dog-friendly, some are not.

BIKING

Rolling routes through quaint villages and past Vermont farms and orchards, over covered bridges and across lush valleys, and up majestic mountains surrounding pristine lakes make cycling the ideal way to enjoy Vermont's unspoiled scenery. Here you can choose between touring the quiet back roads of the Champlain Valley, or take on the challenge of the forested trails and rollicking terrain of the Northeast Kingdom on your mountain bike – whatever your preference, we have the ride for you.

For some, "man's best friend" is two-wheeled and not four-legged. Those who love their bike and seek every opportunity to spend time together won't bark up the wrong tree cycling in Vermont, with or without their pet. There are hundreds of miles of roads


and trails, from scenic, leisurely rides to heart-pumping single track adventures, kid-friendly bike paths to hill workouts on mountain access roads and adrenaline-fueled downhill descents powered by lift-access. Bike centers, tour operators, bike organizations, resorts and lodging choices are as plentiful and as accommodating as the options to peddle your way through Vermont.

Looking for an organized, simplified solution that enables you to experience Vermont from the saddle worry-free? Try an inn-to-inn bike tour. You'll rise and shine in a beautiful, comfortable inn, ride at your own pace amidst the sights and sounds of one of the world's most stunning locations, and relax with warm, friendly

people over fine food at day's end. If you do intend to bring your pet, always call ahead to be sure he or she can be accommodated or make arrangements for Fido to be well taken care of while you are on the road. (Please see page 85 of this guidebook to find an organized bike trip.)

From extreme to the mainstream, Vermont's alpine and cross country resorts also offer mountain bike terrain in summer and fall, many served by lifts to enable quick ascent to diverse trail networks. Check the **Vermont Ski Areas Association**'s website to find a resort open for mountain biking (www.ski-vermont.com).

ESSEX



Traveling without your pet but want to experience the thrill of mountain biking? Other human-only options include the **Catamount Outdoor Family Center** in Williston, just outside of Burlington (www.catamountoutdoor.com) and the bike terrain

park for both mountain and BMX bikes at **Grafton Ponds Outdoor Center** in Grafton. Three terrain loops feature jumps, switchbacks, and teeter-totters; don't miss "Ravine Run" – an exciting series of drops, deep turns, and bridges down the side of Grafton Ponds' steep ravine. Grafton Ponds Outdoor Center welcomes dogs on Mondays and Thursdays. This facility offers guided tours for all levels and abilities (www.graftonponds.com).

SWIMMING

Who doesn't love a cool, refreshing dip when the dog days of summer arrive? From sandy beaches to a backyard pond or pool, crystalline mountain lakes to spring-fed quarries, the options for swimming in clear, clean waters are plentiful throughout the state. One "big lake" destination is Lake Champlain's **North Beach** in Burlington, open Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day (www.enjoyburlington.com/northbeach.cfm). North Beach welcomes dogs on leashes. Other larger bodies of water for swimming include Lake Carmi, Bomoseen or Lake Willoughby; for smaller options, choose Silver Lake in Barnard, Lake St. Catherine or Lake Elmore. It's a safe bet to ask your innkeeper or concierge for their personal favorite too; swimming holes off the beaten path can be closely guarded secrets and are yet as well worth exploring as more popular destinations.

GOING TO THE DOGS

According to the American Pet Products Association National Pet Owners Survey, over 46 million households own a dog; in fact, it's likely more than one as total number of dogs owned as pets exceeds 78 million. We pamper them, bring them wherever we roam, and surprise them with something new often, whether stylish accessories, gourmet treats or escape to points unknown.

FISHING

There are fish tails and tributes and then there's the one that got away. In Vermont, fishing is a favorite pastime of visitors and Vermonters alike. One of the few activities that engage the passions and interests of everyone from kids to great-grandparents, catching "the big one" in Vermont is sometimes challenging, often exciting, and always rewarding, no matter how your fish stacks up. With more than 20 popular species of game and panfish to be found in the lakes, ponds, rivers, and brooks of Vermont, chances are your catch will be just fine and the lifelong bond between generations of family and friends made on the water will endure.

Vermont's family-friendly fishing spots are dispersed across the state and offer families an excellent chance of catching rainbow, brook or lake trout, or perch, bass or pickerel from shore or in a boat. Kids under 15 years can get started without a license; for more information and "Trophy Trout" designated sites, contact the **Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife** (www.vtfishandwildlife.com). (Your pet doesn't need a license but make sure to keep them away from the hook!) Local outfitters also offer guided tours and lessons. Or, take part in one of the many competitive, fundraising fishing derbies on Lake Champlain annually (www.lciderby.com).

If you're ready to hook some human-only time, try an Orvis-endorsed fly fishing excursion in Essex at **The Essex, Vermont's Culinary Resort and Spa** (www.vtculinaryresort.com), pick up a fly rod at the **Orvis Manchester Fly Fishing School at The Equinox Resort** in Manchester Village (www.equinoxresort.com) or experience a private fishing lodge on Lake Champlain when you stay at **Charlie's Northland Lodge** on North Hero Island, with discounts available just for anglers (www.charliesnorthlandlodge.com).

BOATING

Float, paddle, motor, sail, cruise...so many ways to explore Vermont's bodies of water. Be adventurous and engage the thrilling speed of a powerboat or Jet Ski. Be silent and stealth-like in a kayak or canoe. Harness the wind power of a sailboat, hot dog off the high cliffs into the deep pools of a quarry, or simply bob lazily along down a river on a tube. Lakes and ponds, reservoirs and rivers dot all regions of the state for ready access and every mood and budget.

Ready to add an air of elegance and fine dining to your on-water experience? Drop Fido at a friend's house for a play date all his own and climb on board the **Spirit of Ethan Allen III**, a floating restaurant, banquet facility, and cruise ship on Lake Champlain, offering themed dinner cruises that take you on an entertaining adventure like no other (www.soea.com). **Vermont Discovery Cruises** feature various multi-day and night vacation cruises aboard The Moonlight Lady, exploring the coastline, islands and broad waters of Lake Champlain from Burlington to the northernmost reaches of the lake and even as far north as Montreal, Canada (www.vermontmoonlightlady.com).

TWO-LEGGED VERMONT VACATIONS

Traveling with your four-legged best friend is not for everyone. If your vacation is for human adventurers only there are plenty of outdoor activities for you to experience with the energy and enthusiasm of a happy dog, even if you left him at home.

GOLF

Golfers are a unique breed, hot on the trail of birdies and eagles that have nothing to do with feathers. Yet their exuberance is rewarded in Vermont, where the natural landscape is well-suited for challenging but very playable courses, many with breathtaking views. It's never been easier or more fun to play a few rounds in Vermont. The **Vermont Golf Association** features courses designed by such renowned golf architects as Jack Nicklaus, Robert Trent Jones, Sr., Graham Cooke & Associates, and more (www.vtga.org).

Whether you tee it up at a resort or play a round on a public course, the design and scenery will be memorable. **The Hermitage Golf Club at Haystack Mountain** in Wilmington is a Desmond Muirhead-designed 6,549 yard, par 72 championship course (www.hermitagegolfclub.com); the course at the **Mount Snow Golf Club**, designed by New England course architect Geoffrey Cornish, is an 18-hole par 72 championship course with stunning Green Mountain views. New to the sport or hoping to perfect your swing? **The Original Golf School at Mount Snow** was one of the first golf schools in the country. The **Okemo Inn** in Ludlow offers golf packages (www.okemoinn.com) at Okemo Valley Golf Club; **Stratton Mountain Resort** features a championship, 27-hole golf course with slopeside village (www.stratton.com) and golf school founded by Arnold Palmer; The **Village Green** at Stowe is a family condominium resort adjacent to the Stowe Country Club (www.vgasstowe.com); and the **Sugarbush Resort** in Warren is home to a Robert Trent Jones, Sr. 18-hole course with golf camps and clinics for men, women and juniors (www.sugarbush.com).

From human-powered recreation to leisure sports, motorized escapes to nature-based entertainment, you'll want to come back again and again, whether for the mild or the wild side.

For your daily dose of adrenaline, many of Vermont's alpine resorts transform into adventure centers when the snow melts. The **Pump House at Jay Peak** is Vermont's first water park, with 50,000 square feet of fun, featuring a myriad of slides and the near-vertical LaChute, which launches riders into a free-fall, reaching speeds of up to 40 mph with a force of 2.5 Gs (www.jaypeakresort.com). **ArborTrek Canopy Adventures at Smugglers' Notch Resort** lead

riders on a zipline canopy tour, soaring through the forest on a series of ziplines, suspension bridges, and rappels (www.arbortrek.com). And Okemo's **Timber Ripper**, a 375 vertical-foot roller coaster descent along 3,100 feet of track, follows the contours of the mountain with added waves, camel backs, banking loops and a "twister" section (www.okemo.com). Don't miss **Stowe Mountain Resort's Alpine Slide**, **Bromley's Aerial Adventure Park** or the **Sun Mountain Flyer**, too (www.stowe.com, www.bromley.com). For thrills Vermont-style, dial in and turn it up with one of these high mountain adventures.

ARBORTREK CANOPY ADVENTURES, JEFFERSONVILLE

Vermont is home to even more extreme pursuits: glide through our skies with a parachute on your back and gorgeous fall foliage beneath you; scale boulders in Bolton or climb the Notch (Smugglers' Notch in Jeffersonville). Whether rock climbing, caving, hang gliding, whitewater rafting, or skydiving, Vermont is a thrill a minute destination for those with nerves of steel. Visit the **Vermont Outdoor Guide Association** for specifics and resources to plan an extreme outing (www.voga.org).

A scenic helicopter or hot air balloon ride awaits the more laid-back explorer eager to claim a unique vantage point. **Silver Maple Lodge & Cottages** in Fairlee (www.silvermaplelodge.com) offers a Balloon Inn Vermont Vacation option with lodging and a champagne balloon ride so you can leave the planning to your hosts and just enjoy the ride. Or, see why *Frommer's* recommends the spectacular view of Vermont's famous foliage from a balloon ride over Lake Champlain with **Above Reality, Inc. Hot Air Balloon Rides** as one of the World's Best Ten Hot Air Balloon Adventures (www.balloonvermont.com). If rotors are more your style, **Mansfield Heliflight** of Milton offers one-hour sightseeing tours in a variety of aircraft (www.mansfieldheliflight.com). Sit back in the bubble-windowed cabin of the four-seat Robinson R-44, equipped with headphones for ease of communications, and take in the views of the Green Mountains, the foliage and the lakes region. With all the incredible outdoor opportunities for fun and adventure in Vermont for humans and for pets, the thought of boredom is "prepawsterous!" 



Come for a Visit, Stay for a Lifetime: Profiles of Vermonters-at-Heart

People are drawn to Vermont – beautiful mountains, neighborly and culturally rich downtowns, wholesome food that is fresh and local, and “get out and play” diversions that exist harmoniously with other commitments. We asked four people who chose to settle here: what led them to their decision to “make Vermont home?”

Kelly Pawlak: Mount Snow Resort General Manager, 27 years • Dover • www.mountsnow.com

What brought me to Vermont? I grew up skiing. After college, I was suddenly faced with a winter without my dad ready and willing to pay for my season pass. So I went searching for a job at a ski area and found one at Mount Snow Resort in southern Vermont. The longer I worked at Mount Snow, the more I fell in love with the ski industry and this region of Vermont in winter and of course, summer.



What keeps me here? It sounds kind of corny but the primary reason I stay at Mount Snow is because I love the people I work with and the skiers and riders who come to this resort and its surrounding community year after year. Vermont is a great place to raise a family and take advantage of all the amazing recreational opportunities at the resort and around this region of Vermont. Because of where we live and what I do, my kids have had a lot of cool experiences. They've had a more active lifestyle than most, growing up skiing, meeting pro athletes, and that is such a great benefit. Every day I wake up anxious to get to the mountain and leave at the end of the day wanting to accomplish more. Where else do you get to spend your days with healthy, happy and fun people...and get paid for it?

Mark Simakaski: Owner of Artesano Mead, 5 years • Groton • www.artesanomead.com

What brought me to Vermont? Vermont's people, creatures, and ecosystem are what enticed me to come to the Green Mountain State. Honeybees visit about 1,500,000 flowers to make one bottle of mead, or honey wine. I discovered Vermont has so many resources for producing our wine, and that people have raised a consistent honey crop here for hundreds of years. A healthy environment and productive bees are critical to the production of mead; one colony of bees contains 40,000 to 60,000 individuals and can produce enough honey for about 90 bottles. We had been beekeeping for a number of years ourselves and realized that making mead in Vermont was a business strategy with great potential.

What keeps me here? What made us stay was not only the support of small fruit growers and Vermonters in general, but also the great landscape in which we are able to work. With four active seasons and a beautiful backdrop, our honey wine business has continued to grow year after year. With such priority placed upon locally produced products, Vermont is a destination for “foodies” from all over. Our mead is crafted from essences that define Vermont. In addition to traditional mead, we make seasonal varieties such as blueberry, raspberry, cranberry, spiced, and chili cinnamon. As a business, we are committed to sourcing our honey and fruit from local producers so that our mead reflects all of the great flavors that Vermont has to offer.

What brought me to Vermont? My husband Jack and I both worked as ambassadors and taught skiing at Killington Ski Resort. We bought a ski house which eventually became our permanent home. Our sons competed in freestyle ski competitions and attended Killington Mountain School. I earned my master's degree in art from Norwich University and my husband went to Middlebury College.



What keeps me here? My artistic inspiration comes from the beauty found in Vermont, the magnificent views of Mount Mansfield that I see from my window at our summertime waterfront house in North Hero, as well as the beauty of Killington in winter. I guess I have the best of both worlds.

My husband and I also love Vermont because of its music and art. He plays in a group called "Potluck Folk Singers." I was one of the founding members of Killington Artists Guild which is still in existence today. Recent projects include a poetry book *Gathering of Poets* for which my painting was selected for the cover. Two of my poems are included in the book as well. I am a member of the Vermont Watercolor Society, Island Arts, Chaffee Art Center, League of Vermont Writers and National League of American Pen Women.

What brought me to Vermont? Family brought me here. After spending many years in some of the world's largest cities (Seoul, Tokyo, Hong Kong, Singapore) we were ready to settle down in a less urban environment. In the early 80s I had summer jobs in Burlington, and came to love the scale of this wonderful place; large enough to offer many of the things that big cities have, but more intimate and socially connected. Burlington topped our list so we dug into savings and made a go of it.

What keeps me here? One very critical thing that keeps me here is this wonderful, buoyant sense that the progressive things that we're doing in Vermont have meaningful impact on the world. I take immense pleasure in working directly with exceptional people and institutions that are making a difference, which is rewarding and invigorating. Through my profession I have taken on projects that allow me to participate in the local food movement, environmental and social services fields, a more sustainable energy future, delivering healthcare services to the rural areas of the state, transforming the higher education model to be less costly and more adult learner friendly, reconnecting our children with nature, and more. It gives me a great sense of pride to be able to take the skills that I've learned in the greater world working for multinational companies and to be able to put these skills to use in a place to which I am deeply connected.



Connections to my extended family keep me here as well. My maternal grandmother came from the Vermont side of Lake Champlain. I uncovered that my great-great-great-great-great grandfather, Dan Johnson, came to what was then the New Hampshire Grants in 1787 and was one of the original Incorporators of Williston, where I now live. By sheer happenstance, I bought a farm house on a part of that original Johnson farmland. Freaky – and so intriguing! On my dad's side, I'm a direct descendant of a Green Mountain Boy, who was part of the citizen militia established in 1760 and led by Ethan Allen to maintain territorial independence. History's an amazing thing. I just hope that I can impact some small part of Vermont's history.

DELIA GILLEN, HIGH MOWING SEEDS

In recent years, the notion of eating “farm-to-plate” has captured the attention of culinary aficionados, and even some mainstream eaters, across the country.

From seed, to soil, to the table, the Vermont food system is a complex network. It takes cooperation and a sense of community to create and sustain a food system so deeply integrated. And from that commitment, a food hub has emerged.

On the threshold of Vermont’s Northeast Kingdom lies the town of Hardwick. A post-Civil War granite quarrying town, about a decade ago the **Center for an Agricultural Economy** quietly took root in Hardwick with the goal of supporting and advancing a healthy regional food system (www.hardwickagriculture.org). Within the last half a dozen years Hardwick has emerged as a hub for Vermont’s food economy.

Hardwick’s legacy is rooted in agriculture. From the town’s **Kimball House**, a c.1890 three-room Victorian B&B located on land that was once part of a subsistence farm, to **Vermont Natural Coatings** – leveraging whey byproducts from Vermont’s vibrant cheesemaking industry to create natural, non-toxic wood finishes – the ingenuity of Hardwick’s people has created a momentum for innovation in this plucky town (www.kimballhouse.com, www.vermontnaturalcoatings.com).

In fact, author and environmentalist Bill McKibben noted upon visiting Hardwick five years ago: “After spending a day in Hardwick, I feel a great burst of pleasure and possibility. Deep and transformative things are happening here. Hardwick has all the pieces of a healthy food system connected and ready to fall into place, and is as far ahead in sustainable agriculture as any place in the country.”

And fall in place, they have. Two years after McKibben’s declaration, Vermont author Ben Hewitt penned the book *The Town That Food Saved: How One Community Found Vitality in Local Food* (Rodale Books, 2010), exploring the region’s “agripreneurs” in what has been dubbed the “Silicon Valley of local food.” And since then, the momentum has continued to build.

Case in point: Agripreneur Tom Stearns and the butternut squash.

IT STARTS WITH A SEED

Tom Stearns first fell in love with gardening. His respect, fascination, and appreciation for seeds soon followed, leading to a life-long commitment to sustainable agriculture.

Stearns is the president and founder of **High Mowing Organic Seeds**, located just beyond Hardwick’s border in Wolcott, Vermont. High Mowing grows and markets about 650 varieties of organic and heirloom vegetable, flower, and herb seeds through catalogs and retail garden stores nationwide.

"If we can figure out how to farm better, we can figure out how to have an abundant future on this planet," claims Stearns, a Connecticut native who settled in Vermont in 1996. This is where seeds come in. "In order to farm better, we need seeds that thrive even under great stress," Stearns says.

Butternut squash is no exception. High Mowing Seeds is selling three varieties of butternut squash this season, among them, a squash known as Nutterbutter which matures in just ninety days. Producing a squash like Nutterbutter doesn't happen overnight. In fact, it can take up to ten years to make a new seed variety that is up to Stearns' standards. In the case of Nutterbutter, it took High Mowing's plant breeder, Jodi Lew-Smith, five.

When it comes to growing one's own food, patience really is a virtue. "The people who buy our seeds care deeply about the environment and about being stewards of the land," says Stearns. "They are committed to growing good, healthy food, and leaving the world a little better off than they found it."

FROM SEED TO HARVEST

High Mowing Seeds are used by farmers beyond Vermont's Northeast Kingdom as well as nationwide. Christa Alexander and her husband Mark Fashing have been farming in Jericho, a town located in the same county as Burlington, Vermont's largest city, since 2002. After attending Williams College, Alexander tried several jobs and traveled a bit, but something pulled her back to her family's land. "I've always felt connected to the land," she says.

Another example of Vermont agripreneurs, she and Mark own and operate **Jericho Settlers Farm**. Through their Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program, community members pay in advance for a season's worth of farm-raised meat, eggs, and fresh vegetables, which are distributed weekly. This popular direct-to-consumer model is a mainstay of Vermont agriculture, and Jericho Settlers Farm runs one of the state's most successful programs.

Alexander, who believes it is important to buy local, appreciates High Mowing Seeds' high quality product and commitment to sustainability. In the fall, she sells butternut squash at her farm stand. The majority are put in cold storage and included as part of the Jericho Settlers' Winter CSA.

"Our community is really supportive of us, and we try to give back," Alexander says. The Farm has established a relationship with nearby Richmond Elementary School. "The kids come to the farm and help harvest vegetables – including our butternut squash – from the field; they serve our food in the cafeteria...it's a great program."



THE SEEDS OF THE FUTURE

For Vermonters of all ages, eating locally is simply and naturally a way of life. It is a deeply ingrained, instinctual practice that starts early and stems from a commitment to the land and strong relationships with local farmers. "Kids who grow up on farms, meet farmers, visit farms, and understand how farming works are more likely to make healthy choices," says Koi Boynton of the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, who helps oversee Vermont's Farm to School program.

More than half of Vermont's schools incorporate Farm to School programs into their curriculum. "A successful Farm to School program integrates the three C's: cafeteria, classroom, and community," says Boynton. "Serve farm-fresh food in the cafeteria; integrate farm education into the classroom. Connect to the local community and build a foundation for the future."

Picking a butternut squash, learning how to prepare it for eating, and understanding the math behind selling it to a customer gives students an up-close look at the food system. "The kids start to see the vegetable in a whole new way. They try new things" says Boynton. "They create healthy eating habits, and also gain respect for farming and the importance of agriculture."

This, Boynton says, helps ensure that the food system in Vermont grows even stronger and more integrated in the future.

"Healthy kids, viable farms, strong communities – it all works together," she says. "From seed, to soil, to school, Vermont is building a sustainable food system."

Vermont Blazes a New African American Heritage Trail

Vermont history is defined by its people: Native occupation dating back 10,000 years, pivotal Revolutionary War events, crucial Civil War support, U.S. presidents, senators and leaders whose work contributed to the foundation of our country. While a large part of Vermont's role in our culture is widely known, it is the Green Mountain State's place in African American history that is not as familiar to many.

In order to provide a window into African Americans' role in shaping the destiny of Vermont and Vermonters, the Vermont Department of Tourism and Marketing launched the **Vermont African American Heritage Trail**. Along the trail, visitors will be able to tour destinations and experience exhibits that speak to Vermont's place in African American history.

Executive Director of Vermont Partnership for Fairness and Diversity Curtiss Reed, who played a key part in the development of this trail, noted that census records indicate that Vermont's African American population has always been a fraction of the

overall population. However, as Reed observes, "The history is here. African Americans fought alongside Ethan Allen as members of the Green Mountain Boys who brought Vermont to independence in 1777. And by 1810 we see that Vermont welcomed African Americans to establish roots in this rocky soil as evidenced by enclaves of early black settlers in Hinesburg, Guilford and Grafton." Reed, a Brattleboro resident whose knowledge and enthusiasm was a catalyst for establishing the Vermont African American Heritage Trail, adds, "It is exciting that this history will be available to Vermont's many visitors."

Follow the trail to select museums and historical sites that retell the stories of the people, places and stories that populate three centuries of American and African American history in Vermont.

Vermonters penned the first constitution in America prohibiting slavery. The year was 1777, just one year after the American Revolution, and the place was a roadside tavern in Windsor. Preserved for visitors, today it is the **Old Constitution House State Historic Site** (www.historicsites.vermont.gov/constitution).

Rokeby Museum, a National Historic Landmark and Underground Railroad site, is described as “unrivaled” by the National Park Service. The home and farm of Quaker abolitionists, a new exhibit tells the true stories of fugitives from slavery who were sheltered there in the 1830s. Tours of the home in which this history was created are also available (www.rokeby.org).

Old Stone House Museum includes a number of historic buildings in this small Northeast Kingdom village. One of them, “Athenian Hall,” was the stately Brownington Academy dormitory built in 1834 by Alexander Twilight, the nation’s first African American to graduate from college. This and related exhibits speak to the accomplishments of Reverend Twilight, including his work as an educator, minister and the first African American elected to serve in the Vermont Legislature (www.oldstonehousemuseum.org).




OLD STONE HOUSE MUSEUM, BROWNINGTON

Brandon Museum and Visitor Center is located in the historic birthplace of Stephen A. Douglas, who is known today primarily for the famous Lincoln/Douglas debates of 1860. Exhibits include a counterpoint to Douglas’ pro-slavery stance with fascinating documentation of the development of abolitionist societies in Brandon (www.brandon.org/things-to-do/the-brandon-museum).

Historically black colleges and universities owe their existence to Senator Justin Smith Morrill and his 1862 Land Grant College Act and its companion legislation, the Land Grant College Act of 1890. Visitors to the **Justin Morrill Homestead State Historic Site** will experience Morrill’s passion for learning that he extended to all through his legislative work (www.historicsites.vermont.gov/morrill).

Hildene, The Lincoln Family Home, welcomes visitors to the summer home of Robert Todd Lincoln. Lincoln served as president and CEO of the Pullman Car Company. A



VERMONT AND THE CIVIL WAR VISITORS GUIDE

In a related piece, visitors may explore 46 Vermont locations that offer compelling stories of Vermont’s support of the Union cause. Visit New England’s best documented stop on the Underground Railroad, the factory where the gun milling machines that armed the nation were produced, and the resort where Mary Lincoln and her children summered in 1864. Experience the fervor of abolitionists, the bravery and dedication of Vermont’s soldiers, and the drama of the northern-most land action of the Civil War. Get a guide and learn more at the website celebrating Vermont’s role in the Civil War (www.vermontcivilwar150.org).



compelling new exhibit explores the layers of history leading to the organization of the first black labor union in 1925 and the rise of the African American middle class (www.hildene.org).

Visitors will learn about one of Vermont’s most intriguing residents, Daisy Turner, at the **Grafton Historical Society**. Turner was born in 1883 to former slaves Alexander and Sally Turner at their home in this small village. She lived 104 years and told riveting stories that traced the family history from Africa to their journey out of slavery and into the 20th century (www.graftonhistoricalsociety.org).

Middlebury includes two noteworthy sites. Listen to **Daisy Turner** talk about her family’s saga at the **Vermont Folklife Center**, and

visit **Middlebury College**, the first American college to award a degree to an African American, **Alexander Twilight** (www.vermontfolklifecenter.org, www.middlebury.edu).

When the kids are happy, everyone is happy. Luckily, it's easy to keep children content in Vermont! Whether your little one gets excited about history, traditional crafts, or athletics, the Green Mountain State offers endless possibilities for contagious grins that will spread to the grownups in the crowd.

HISTORY KIDS

A king and queen, knights and ladies, peasants, craftsmen, and farmers all gather at the **Open Fields Medieval Festival** in Thetford on May 25th. During this family-friendly celebration, the town center comes alive with the sights and sounds of a medieval village. Come in costume for music of the Middle Ages, dance, games of skill and chance, authentic food, a parade, falconry, and storytelling. Meet Benny the Dragon, and enjoy feats of juggling and acrobatics. Check out the catapult, try your hand at jousting, and take part in a knighting ceremony. Even teens will go home happy (www.vtmedfest.com).

Every kid looks forward to the 4th of July, and Vermont's traditions can offer a new take on the typical New England celebration. With Green Mountain liberty and freedom of expression, here are two ways to experience Independence Day with a twist:

The **Warren 4th of July** is a wacky, thought-provoking, family experience. Creative displays, addressing current day politics and world events with tongue-in-cheek themes that demonstrate the influence of freedom of speech and upstage traditional floats, fire trucks, and tractors. Dance, eat, and cavort in the warmth of summer; celebrate the birth of our country's independence and spirit. Free kids' activities and street dance follow the parade (www.facebook.com/warren4thofjuly).

For the more traditionally inclined, the 4th of July **President Calvin Coolidge Birthday Celebration at the Calvin Coolidge State Historic Site** commemorates the only U.S. president born on Independence Day. At noon, march with members of the Vermont National Guard from the village green to the cemetery where a wreath from the White House is laid at the President's gravesite. After the ceremony, return to the village for chicken barbecue, wagon rides, historic craft demonstrations, and a special musical performance at the church in this authentic, preserved 19th-century village (www.historicsites.vermont.gov/coolidge).

CRAFTY KIDS

Vermont is known for innovation, while at the same time opportunities abound for children of all ages to learn and participate in our cultural heritage through hands-on experiences from the past.

Vermont is deeply rooted in farming as a part of our legacy and a way of the future. Vermont experienced a "sheep boom" in the 1820s, as hillside farms devoted to the growth of ewes, rams, and lambs dotted the land. In Woodstock on May 4-5, Billings Farm hosts **Sheep Shearing & Herding** with Border Collies, offering a chance to experience this important part of Vermont's rural tradition. This wooly weekend is devoted to Southdown sheep and their herding friends. Watch the Border Collies herding sheep in the farm fields and the shearing of the Farm's ewes; take a turn at carding wool and observe the fleece being spun into yarn. Billings' beautiful barns host wool and sheep-themed craft activities for kids, including a "make-it & take-it" sheep handprint (www.billingsfarm.org).

Explore our heritage with collections of art and Americana for all ages at the **Shelburne Museum** where over 150,000 works are exhibited in a remarkable setting of 39 exhibition buildings, 25 of which are historic and were relocated to the Museum grounds (www.shelburnemuseum.com). Little ones may participate in daily craft activities that tie into the Museum's exhibitions at the Owl Cottage Family Activity Center. Monthly Saturday morning programs will encourage families to explore – through story and art-making – the exciting exhibitions in the Museum's new Center for Art and Education, opening in fall 2013.

Wood products are also a piece of Vermont's cultural and craft heritage. Working lands continue to be a focus of Vermont's traditions at the **10th Annual Vermont Fine Furniture, Woodworking & Forest Festival** in Woodstock on September 28-29, where visitors will experience the story of how Vermonters care for our woods, from forest to finished product. While adults will relish the showcase of magnificent works of art borne from our bounty of trees, crafty kids will be drawn to the demonstration space, featuring bowl turners, boat makers, chairwrights, and carvers. HOOKED, HORSE-LOVING, AND HIGH-FLYING KIDS

Kids are great at telling the story of “the big one that got away” but at the **32nd Annual LCI Father's Day Derby** presented by Yamaha on June 15-17, the big one just may have to stay hooked to win one of hundreds of prizes for anglers of any ability. With jumping in common, high-flying kids will relate to the young performers – ages 10 to 18 – who star as aerialists, clowns, acrobats, jugglers, wirewalkers, and unicyclists in **Circus Smirkus**, Vermont's own homegrown, award-winning youth circus. Hikers are asked to avoid all trails that appear muddy or wet during this season to prevent channeling water, loosening soil, and trampling vegetation and soil adjacent to the trail surface.



Customs Information

All travelers entering the United States from Canada must present one of the following travel documents: U.S. Passport or Passport Card, Enhanced Driver's License (EDL) or Trusted Traveler Card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST). These documents are available in some U.S. states and Canadian provinces. For U.S. customs information, visit www.cbp.gov; for Canadian Customs, www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca.

U.S. and Canadian citizen children under age 16 arriving by land or sea from contiguous territory may also present an original or copy of his or her birth certificate, a Consular Report of Birth Abroad, a Naturalization Certificate, or a Canadian Citizenship Card.

U.S. and Canadian citizen children under age 19 arriving by land or sea from contiguous territory and traveling with a school group, religious group, social or cultural organization, or sports team, may also present an original or copy of his or her birth certificate, a Consular Report of Birth Abroad, a Naturalization Certificate, or a Canadian Citizenship Card.

Travelers other than U.S. citizens, legal U.S. residents and Canadian citizens must have a passport and visa when applicable and must give the purpose of their visit and planned length of stay.

Certain plants, fruits, vegetables, meats and prepared meats are prohibited. Dogs and other pets must have, from their veterinarian, a recent certificate of a rabies shot noting that the animal does not have any contagious disease.

The snow season runs from late November through early April with daytime highs often below freezing, suitable winter clothing and warm, waterproof footwear are recommended. In general, temperatures will usually be cooler at higher elevations in the mountains.



Waterfalls

NORTHERN VT

STOWE

Bingham Falls, West Branch Waterbury River, 90'
On Rte. 108, about 1/2 mile past the Mount Mansfield Toll Road. Unmarked pull-off on the north side of the road. Trail leads downhill to the falls and gorge. The trail goes to the river above the falls, runs upstream to a crossing, then follows the opposite bank downstream.

Moss Glen Falls, Moss Glen Brook, 125'

3 miles on Rte. 100 north of Stowe, turn right on Randolph Road, then right again on Moss Glen Falls Road. Park at the well-maintained parking area on the left, just before the road takes a 90 degree right turn across a narrow bridge. The falls are a short walk on a well-worn trail. Peregrine Falcons have been known to nest in adjacent cliffs.

TROY

Big Falls, Missisquoi River, 40'
On River Road, about 1.5 miles south of Rte. 105. Large, unmarked turnoff on the west side of the road. Falls are about 200 feet from parking area. Largest undammed waterfall on a major river in Vermont. The clifftop overlook is not fenced.

CENTRAL VT

BOLTON

Honey Hollow Falls, Preston Brook, 64'

Take Rte. 2 to Jonesville and go across the new Winooski River bridge. Turn immediately left on River Road. In about 2 miles, you'll see Honey Hollow Road on your right. Drive up this narrow dirt road and look for a small parking area on your left on the steep portion of the road. There should be 3 large rocks here. You'll hear the falls, which are only about 100' through the woods.

BRISTOL

Bristol Memorial Park Falls, Baldwin Creek, 47'
Also known as Burnhams Falls or The Flume. From Bristol, go about 4 miles north on Rte. 116. Turn right on Route 17. The parking area is well-marked as you approach, with a short trail leading to the falls. Continuing across the footbridge, you'll find a loop trail back to Route 17 above the parking area.

FAIRLEE

Glen Falls, Glen Falls Brook, 75'

From Rte. 5 in Fairlee, turn east on Lake Morey Rd. Drive 1.5 miles, park in fishing access parking lot. Trail begins to the south.

Small waterfall is about 3/10 mile away, and larger cascades are above on steeper terrain.

GRANVILLE

Moss Glen Falls, Deer Hollow Brook, 30'

Likely the most photogenic waterfall in the state, it is located next to Rte. 100 in Granville Gulf. Large parking area is a few hundred feet up the road from the falls. A boardwalk leads back to the falls, passing Little Moss Glen Falls on the way.

HANCOCK

Texas Falls, Hancock Brook, 35'

From Hancock, turn west onto Rte. 125. After about 3.5 miles, turn right on the well-signed road for Texas Falls. There is a paved parking lot across from the falls. Swimming at the falls is not allowed. The bridge over the gorge provides views.

LUDLOW

Buttermilk Falls, Branch Brook, 35'

This waterfall is located a mile north of Ludlow. Just off Rte. 103, by the VFW, is Buttermilk Falls Road. The falls are near the end of the road, just below the old closed bridge. There are 3 different sets of falls here, about 300 feet apart, with the upper two being the more impressive.

QUECHEE

Quechee Village Falls, Ottaquechee River, 15'

South on Rte. 4 for about 1.5 miles. Turn right on Quechee Main Rd. Follow into the village of Quechee. The falls are in the center of town. Enjoy the view of the falls from the picture windows at Simon Pearce restaurant and glassblowing at The Mill at Quechee, 1760 Quechee Main St.

SALISBURY

The Falls of Lana, Sucker Brook, 100'

Take Rte. 7 from Middlebury to Salisbury, turn east onto Rte. 53. Drive about 3 miles, until you see the Silver Lake Power Station. Park off the road along Rte. 53, being sure not to block traffic. The fastest way to the falls is to walk up along the penstocks to the view of the falls from a fenced overlook. Just a little further uphill you will find the trail that leads to the top of the falls and eventually to Silver Lake.

WARREN

Warren Falls, Mad River, 20'

Take Rte. 100 south out of Warren. In 3.4 miles, there is a large turnout on the right. Park here and follow the trail to the falls, which are downstream (right) from the parking area. Wear good footwear, as there is a steep root ladder to get to the pool below.

WEATHERSFIELD

Cascade Falls, Mill Brook, 84'

On the southwest side of Mt. Ascutney is a single tall drop called Cascade Falls, sometimes referred to as Crystal Cascade Falls. Take Exit 8 on I-91. Turn west on Route 131. In about 4 miles, look for Weathersfield Rd. Follow to the parking area. Cascade

Falls is 1.2 miles out on the trail, passing the trickle known as Little Cascade Falls along the way.

SOUTHERN VT

MANCHESTER

Lye Brook Falls, Lye Brook, 160'

From Rte. 7A, turn east on Depot St. (Rtes. 11/30) and drive about 1/2 mile, turning right on Richville Road. At Post Office, turn left on East Manchester Rd., cross beneath Rte. 7. After underpass, turn right on the Lye Brook Falls Access Rd. (the sign might say Glen Road, but there is another sign indicating Lye Brook Falls access) and follow it to the end and park. The trail exits the parking lot at the far end. The first several yards are on rounded and somewhat slippery rocks, but this changes to a level former rail bed. The falls are reached in 2.3 miles.

Wildlife Watching and Birding

In summer and autumn Vermont is home to hundreds of wildlife species, from brightly colored blue jays and red-bellied woodpeckers, whitetail deer and gray fox, to Vermont's state bird, the hermit thrush. The fortunate observer may even catch a glimpse of a peregrine falcon, bald eagle or moose.

Whether you intend to or not, you may end up watching wildlife while enjoying other great outdoor activities such as hiking or canoeing. Your innkeeper or concierge can direct you to local wildlife watching or birding spots, and you might even find organized birding excursions in your area.

Be sure to dress in layers and bring snacks and water in a day pack, even if you're planning a short trip. If you're planning to hike, supportive, water-proof footwear is a must, and be sure to check the weather report prior to setting out. Field guides are a good idea for identifying the birds and animals that you find. No matter how tame a wild animal may appear, do not approach them. Don't forget your binoculars! Many wildlife preserves and birding areas do have sections that are closed to the public, so be aware of signs and fencing.

Lake and wetlands, breeding location for rare marshbirds. 470 acres.

ROCKINGHAM

HERRICK'S COVE

Along the Connecticut River. 395 acres.



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
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
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
